Speaker Series Fall 2006

Alexander Cockburn, celebrated columnist at *The Nation* and other venues and co-editor of the online magazine *Counter-Punch*, spent an evening in Aberdeen during October 2005 as the Institute's first speaker. Mr. Cockburn held an audience of more than 150 spellbound for over two hours with his witty, searing analysis of current events in the United States.

Back by popular demand, the lecture on October 19, 2006 promises to be equally engaging as he ponders The New American Crisis and where we are in the world today.

Born and raised in Ireland, Cockburn has lived and worked in America since 1973. He has established a reputation as one of the foremost reporters and commentators of the left through writing newspaper and magazine columns over the past decade. Mr. Cockburn's areas of interest include the American political scene, economics, the environment, labor issues and international policy.

He is coeditor with Jeffrey St. Clair of the twice-monthly muckraking newsletter *CounterPunch*, whose Web site, www.counterpunch.org, now has a world audience in the millions.

Mr. Cockburn's return is supported in part by a grant from Humanities Washington a statewide non-profit organization supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities and local contributions.

Angela Davis
is coming to
Grays Harbor
April 18, 2007

Professor Davis is known internationally for her ongoing work to combat all forms of oppression in the U.S. and abroad. Over the years, she has been active as a student, teacher, writer, scholar, and organizer; she is a living witness to the historical struggles of the contemporary era.

Davis' political activism began as a youth in Birmingham, Alabama. In 1969 she came to national attention after being removed from her teaching position at UCLA as a result of her social activism and her membership in the Communist Party, USA. In 1970, she was placed on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted List on false charges, and was the subject of an intense police search that drove her underground and culminated in one of the most famous trials in recent history. A massive international "Free Angela Davis" campaign led to her acquittal in 1972. Harnessing the momentum of that campaign, she co-founded the National Alliance Against Racism and Political Repression, which continues its work today.

Professor Davis has lectured in all 50 states, as well as in Africa, Europe, the Caribbean and the former Soviet Union. She is author of five books including "Angela Davis: An Autobiography" and "Women, Race and Class".

Ms. Davis is co-sponsored by Grays Harbor College and will be appearing at the Bishop Center.
